
## LEGENDS OF LITERACY SCAVENGER HUNT

- This multi-talented personality was a radio host, producer, and concert promoter, and you can find a poster for his movie *Mister Rock and Roll* on display in the Roots exhibit.
- There's no doubt that the King of Rock & Roll is a prominently featured **pioneer** and that he even decorated **his guitar** with this interesting symbol.
- Many people came from miles around to hear a certain rock pioneer play his music when the sun goes down, and you can find the handwritten lyrics to this popular education-related song in his exhibit.
- Don't get her wrong: Akron-native Chrissie Hynde wrote this classic Pretenders song about her home town in **1984**, and you can find the **original lyrics** on display.
- 5. One singer with a distinctive **sound** was Otis Redding. The Soul singer's last performance was here in Cleveland, but he played an iconic set of concerts at the Filmore Auditorium in December 1966. If you can find **the concert poster**, you should be able to identify the iconic band that opened for him on his Tuesday night show.

- 6. Beneath the John Lennon's passport and Green Card, you'll find **a song sheet** that Paul McCartney wrote for what iconic ballad?
- 7. Do you love Rock'n'Roll? If so, can you identify the type of electric guitar on display from the "Godmother of Punk," which is hanging next to the jacket she wore on the cover of her iconic album?
- 8. A portrait of this Cleveland singer hangs between some other Musical Women Florence Welch and Tina Weymouth of the Talking Heads. It's not much to go on, but any place is better than starting from zero, you got nothing to lose...
- Before he helped change the sound of rock music in the 70s, this legendary keyboard player was in a band called Rick and the Ravens. You can even see the bandstand logo they used to play on stage.
- You can find this **legendary** performer's **top hat** on display after he threw it offstage at a concert in New York's Carnegie Hall. The hat is as flamboyant as it is patriotic.
- One rock legend is famous for leaning on his friend and bandmate on a classic album cover which has been blown up to fill an entire wall. In the picture, he's wearing this iconic piece of clothing hanging on display.
- 12. See if you can find **the golden vest** worn by this **Cleveland** native, which he wore onstage in 1975.
- To find out who put out *The Pride of Cleveland* LP, all you need to do is look at the cover. Some of the artists included are American Noise and Rapscallion.
